# SIMM-POSIUM #10 - preliminary programme

(version 04.08.2025)

Monday, November 24, the symposium will open with a keynote speech by Prof. Dr. Lee Higgins on the future of participatory music practices. The first session will highlight the role of music in asylum centres and prisons and explore the complex reality of working with music in these centres.

A panel led by Beatriz Ilari will examine the dual role of ensemble education as a place for empowerment and as a structure susceptible to hierarchy and exclusion, with case studies from Brazil, Afghanistan, and the US.

Tuesday, November 25 opens with a session on musical practices that offer cultural continuity and resistance to displaced and marginalized communities. The focus then shifts to the healing and connecting role of music in education, healthcare, and residential environments, using international examples. A panel will discuss how music mediation can support artistic citizenship, curriculum reform, and new ethical-pedagogical approaches in higher music education. Finally, participatory music practices that contribute to citizenship and social cohesion will be discussed, including projects on homelessness and community building in South African townships.

On Wednesday, November 26, morning sessions will focus on the skills needed by socially engaged musicians, with an emphasis on improvisation, intergenerational creativity, traumainformed practice, and the roles of the artist/educator. The field will then be critically examined by SIMM co-founders Brydie Bartleet, Geoff Baker, and Lukas Pairon, who will discuss the conceptual foundations of social music practices. The day will conclude with sessions highlighting the interaction between participatory music projects and formal institutions, offering a critical look at the pedagogical and political possibilities of socially engaged research into participatory music practices.
